Summer Workshops

PASC has been providing Summer Workshops for more than 50 years. The workshops prepare student leaders to make positive, significant differences in their school communities. The different colored sites are for different age groups of student delegates across Pennsylvania. (Blue-Grades 7-9, Gold-Grades 10-12, and Advanced Gold Grades 11-12). The different sites offer different curriculum and activities targeted to create a unique leadership program each year. At **Blue** students begin to learn calendar and project planning, communication skills, leadership, meeting skills, officer organization skills, and self esteem. Delegates partake in a dance, funfair, idea exchange, Junior Olympics, special interest seminars, and talent show.

At **Gold** delegates also take back communication skills, but in addition take back group dynamics, team building, meeting skills and office seminar, how to motivate themselves and others, organizing and project planning, and how to act and be skillful with situational leadership. The recreational activities are group games, idea exchanges, Junior Olympics, and special interest seminars. Similarly **Advanced Gold** is also for high-school students and offers training in community service projects, conflict resolution, diversity and cultural awareness, ethics and principles of leadership, making a presentation, meeting skills, self esteem, and stress management. Delegates get hands on experience running meetings. There is also an ice-cream social, mentoring, program, model councils, and picnic dinner.
